

S.S. "NAUSICAA".

Extract from Lloyd's List dated the 30th May, 1938.

NAUSICAA.—Gangier, May 28.—Panamanian tank steamer Nausicaa on fire and abandoned by the crew, dangerous to navigation, approximate position lat. 39 10 N., long. 4 20 E., 7 30 a.m., May 28.

Marseilles, May 28.
—Crew of Panamanian steamer Nausicaa picked up by the Italian steamer Securitas. Two iron lifeboats abandoned by the crew, dangerous to navigation; wreck on fire. French steamer El Mansour reports by wireless having seen tank steamer on fire in lat. 39 35 N., long. 4 35 E. We suppose this to be the Nausicaa.—Lloyd's Agents.

Marseilles, May 28.—Italian steamer Africana, giving her position as lat. 39 34 N., long. 4 33 E., reports passing close to the burning Panamanian tanker Nausicaa. She steamed round the vessel, which she states was still in flames, with a high column of smoke rising from her. She took on board two metal lifeboats which were floating empty near the tanker and which constituted a danger to shipping. The Italian steamer Orata has also wirelessed sighting the burning tanker, giving her position as lat. 39 38 N., long. 4 26 E. The tanker was aflame and drifting, the Orata reported.—Reuter.
