Dear Sirs,

Reverting to your memorandum of the 30th ultimo respecting the steamer "VILLE D'ARRAS", which is laid up at your port, I have to inform you that as it was not clear from the letter you forwarded from Messrs. Worms & Co., whether it was their intention to withdraw the vessel from classification or to keep her laid up for the time being, the Society's Paris office was asked to explain to the Owners that the Committee would be prepared to allow her class to remain undisturbed in the Register Book if she was to continue to be laid up, subject to the usual letter of undertaking being furnished.

I am now in receipt of a letter from the Society's Paris office, stating that the position has been explained to the Owners there, and I am informed that they are quite prepared to sign such a letter, and the Committee have therefore agreed to the vessel's class remaining undisturbed whilst she is laid up, on the understanding that all overdue surveys and necessary repairs will be carried out before she goes into commission.
