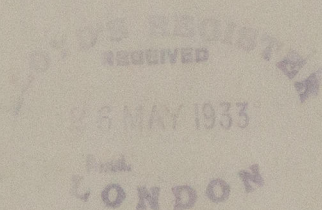

Dear Sir,

In reply to the Classing Letter of
rd instant regarding Newcastle Report No. 90120 on
the General Examination of the Boilers of the s.s.
"KOMPOC", we beg to inform you that, in order to satisfy
ourselves that the port after boiler is in an efficient
condition for harbour purposes, we are of the opinion that
it should be emptied and reasonably cleaned and prepared
for examination on the fire and water sides.

Captain W. H. Matthews, resident at
Liverpool, the Owners' Marine Superintendent, who was present
at the General Examination, did not consider that any preparation
of the boilers was necessary for the examination, and in the
circumstances it is respectfully suggested that the Owners be
communicated with in order that arrangements may be made for
the boiler to be suitably prepared.
