We thank you for your letter of yesterday's date and note that for the purpose of obtaining Certificate for maintenance of class for the voyage to Italy, it will be necessary for a general examination to be carried out by the Society's Surveyors. The vessel in question is at present laid up at Messrs. Palmers, Jarrow.

We will write you further in due course as to when we will require the Survey, if any, to be carried out.

"TWICKENHAM". We note that despite the Certificate issued on 23rd May, a general examination would be necessary as the Freeboard Certificate expired on 31st May last. As we have received advice from London this morning to the effect that delivery will take place very shortly, we deemed the matter of sufficient urgency to telephone your Newcastle Representatives with a request that they should commence examination of this vessel on Tuesday morning next with a view to the Interim Certificate being renewed. We have passed on to them the exact contents of your letter, and we trust that as far as you are concerned, this will be in order.
