
I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of even date respecting your application for an interim certificate to be granted to the s.s. "PEMBROKESHIRE" for a voyage from the U.K./Continent via port or ports to Japan, where it is intended to break her up.

The Committee have had the matter under consideration at their meeting to-day, and as it is understood that this voyage is to be undertaken immediately after her discharge at Hamburg, where it is noted she now is, the Committee will be prepared to authorise the certificate you desire to be granted, provided you will arrange for the vessel to be generally examined by the Society's Surveyors, who will then be authorised to issue the certificate for the voyage to Japan, if they are satisfied that she is in a fit condition for the contemplated voyage.

It is noted that it is proposed to take a cargo of salt from Torrevieja to Japan.
