Dear Sirs:

s.s. "Culmore" of Londonderry. O.N. 143237.

It is with deep regret that I have to inform you that my s.s. "Culmore" left Blyth at about 11.15 on the night of the 11th December and has failed to arrive at her destination at Strood Dock. I understand that a steamer believed to have been the "Culmore" foundered with all hands *on the 13th Dec. 1933 about noon.* about four miles off the Suffolk coast at Aldeburgh and that the bodies of some members of the crew have been identified as those belonging to the "Culmore". The lifeboats answering the description of the "Culmore's" and one lifebuoy with "Culmore" Londonderry, printed thereon, has also been washed up off Bawdsey and - therefore conclude there is no doubt that this boat has been lost.
