Dear Sirs,

S. I have to thank you for your letter of the 20th instant and for your assurance that there is no question of the undertaking already given in respect of the survey and repairs of the steamer "ANDROMEDA" not being carried out if it is eventually decided again to put the vessel in commission, and to say that your remarks have been duly reported to the Committee. They note that a decision will be taken by the Owners within a fortnight at latest as to whether the vessel will be sold for scrapping purposes or the survey proceeded with, and in the circumstances action with regard to dealing with the vessel's class has been deferred for a short time but I am directed to make it quite clear to you that it must be distinctly understood that the Committee can in no case agree to the vessel being moved from Rotterdam as a classed ship unless the Special Survey and all necessary repairs are completed to the entire satisfaction of the Society's Surveyors.
