last regarding the steamer "ANDROMEDA", ex "HUNTRESS", which
H ; vessel was submitted for her 2nd Special Survey No. 1, I have
to report that a few visits were paid principally with a
view to making recommendations for preparing vessel for
Survey and scaling the various parts.

Whilst this was in hand I joined the Surveyor
in the presence of the Owners' Representative and the Master
and found upon examination of No. 2 hold the condition of
the margin plates at side of No. 2 hatchway and all the side
frames bulb angles in way of same such, that very extensive
repairs would be required, the frames in shelter deck space
are all so very bad, the general impression was most
unfavourable.

I advised the Owners' Representative to consult the
Owners before undertaking any repairs as in my opinion the
extent of it could not be overseen, and this was fully
recognised so that I promised to wait their decision before
undertaking any further survey.

The vessel was laid up and no further information
was received so that I wrote their Agents at this Port
for further information.
