MOUNT HYMETTUS.—Oporto, June 13.
—A lifeboat with the master and 12 members of the crew of the Greek steamer Mount Hymettus, which was torpedoed by a German submarine 200 miles north of Leixoes, arrived to-day at Leixoes. The master states that another lifeboat with 11 more members of the crew is coming towards Leixoes, but nothing has been seen yet of this boat. No one was killed or injured by the torpedo. —British United Press.

MOUNT HYMETTUS.—Oporto, June 13.
—Ship's boat belonging to Greek steamer Mount Hymettus, with master and 12 of crew, entered Leixoes to-day. Vessel torpedoed on June 11 about 200 miles from Leixoes.

Madrid, June 14.—Yugo-Slav steamer Sud has arrived at Vigo with 11 survivors of the Greek steamer Mount Hymettus, which was torpedoed by a submarine 200 miles north-west of Oporto last Tuesday (June 11). —Reuter.
