Dear Sirs,

With reference to your letter of the 8th instant addressed to the Society's Liverpool Office, respecting your steamer "ANSELMA DE LARRINAGA" and the general examination which the Committee have previously required with a view to the maintenance of the vessel's class in the Register Book, whilst laid^{up}, I have to acquaint you that your letter was read to the Committee at their meeting today. The Committee appreciate that you do not wish to incur unnecessary expense, but in an examination such as is required in this case the vessel would not need to be specially opened up or cleaned, and the inspection is simply for the purpose of ascertaining if the vessel is in satisfactory condition to retain her class while she is laid up.

As, however, the Committee are assured^{from your letter} that the vessel has been well looked after during her lay-up period, I have the pleasure to say that the requirement to carry out a general examination has been waived in the meantime.


