The case is submitted for the favourable consideration of the Committee.



Although we drew the attention of our Hamburg Branch to the necessity of having the boilers in this vessel surveyed by Lloyd's Register, the survey could not be carried out in consequence of the ice conditions in the harbour and the short stay of the vessel at that Port.

The internal examination of the boilers by the German Boiler Authorities becomes due in May of this year and we respectfully request that we might be permitted to have the survey postponed until that time in order to have the boilers examined by both Lloyd's Register and the German Boiler Authorities simultaneously. We have informed the Engineering Staff on board that the survey is to be held at any rate on vessel's return in May next and the date when the boilers are ready for inspection will be intimated to you in good time and without fail.
