R. With reference to the steamer "SELLINGH", which is reported to have stranded at La Blanche Shoal, River Loire, on the 30th November last, I am directed to say that the Committee will be much obliged if you will kindly favour them with the latest information which you have received as to the extent of damage, prospects of salvage, &c.

The question of making a record of the casualty against the vessel's name in the Register Book will shortly come under the Committee's notice, and it is the practice in cases where it is thought necessary to make such a notation, to expunge at the same time the vessel's class from the Register Book. I shall be glad if you will kindly apprise me, for the Committee's information, of your views on this point.
