Ropes as per the enclosed test certificate
were supplied to the S.S. "Michael" in March
last, to the order of The Booth Steamship Company
Ltd.

This certificate has been returned
by the Marine Superintendent at Liverpool, with
the request that we explain to you why we have not
issued the formal LLOYDS Certificate.

The construction of the ropes in
question is 6 strands, each of 37 wires. Your
specification only includes ropes made 6 by 12, and
6 x 24. Hence we gave our own certificate with the
actual tests. Your requirements for similar sized
ropes made 6 x 24 are 88 and 52½ tons respectively,
and you will see that the actual breaking strains
of the ropes supplied are in excess of your
specification for 6 by 24.
