London, Oct. 7.—In reply to inquiry asking for latest news of the Tigris, which left Antwerp on Sept. 18 for Alexandria and passed Dunkirk on Sept. 19, the owners have cabled Antwerp to-day: Tigris passed one mile N.E. of Cap Neptune. Sept. 19; due Alexandria.

TIGRIS.—Cambr, Oct. 7.—Two lifebuoys marked "Tigris Anvers" have been washed ashore one mile east of Jury's Gap Coastguard Station (not as before reported).

London, Oct. 8.—In reply to inquiry asking if steamer Tigris had arrived, Lloyd's Agent at Alexandria cables to-day as follows: Belgian steamer Tigris not arrived. Agents report expected since Oct. 6. No further news.

TIGRIS.—Rye, Oct. 10.—A lifebuoy marked "TIGRIS—Anvers" was picked up near here at 9.30 a.m. on Oct. 4.

Antwerp, Oct. 11.—It is feared that the Belgian steamer Tigris has sunk with the loss of her crew of 33. A body, which is believed to be that of the master's servant, has been washed up on the French coast at Dunkirk, and it is feared that the vessel has been overwhelmed in the recent heavy gales.—Renter.

TIGRIS.—London, Oct. 14.—The owners of the steamer Tigris write from Antwerp, under date of Oct. 13, that a body, which has been identified as that of Captain Behrings, has been found on the French coast some distance from Dunkirk, and that some packages of cargo, bearing the marks of goods which were shipped on board the steamer Tigris, have been washed ashore on the French coast not far from Boulogne.

Boulogne, Oct. 13.—Portion of a broken boat marked "Tigris" was found on the coast at Audrecelles on Sept. 28 last.

TIGRIS.—Antwerp, Oct. 17.—The owners of the steamer Tigris have received from a correspondent at Wenduine a label, attached to the remains of a bale of tobacco, which had been picked up on the shore. This label corresponds to that of a shipment loaded in No. 3 hold. They have also received a letter from the master of the steamer Willem Rene, in which he states that he navigated in company with the steamer Tigris for 6 hours on Sept. 19. Towards 11 p.m., after passing the Isle of Wight, the master of the Willem Rene lost sight of the Tigris. The weather at that time was very bad. It is, therefore, supposed that the Tigris sank a little beyond the Isle of Wight in the night of Sept. 19-20.—"Neptune."

Boulogne, Oct. 19.—In connection with the wreckage coming from the Tigris, a wooden case marked "am-J" (in circle) — Alexandria — containing 48 small tins of varnish, the label of the firm "The Anglo-Varnish Co., Ltd., Hoboken," has been brought to Boulogne. Wreckage has been found on the shore in the vicinity of Audrecelles.

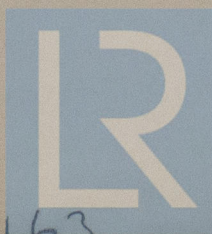

TIGRIS.—London, Oct. 23.—The owners of the steamer Tigris write from Antwerp, under date of Oct. 20, that according to advices from their agent at Boulogne the following goods have been placed in Customs warehouses:—At Audrecelles: 22 bales leaf tobacco. At Wimereux: 13 bales leaf tobacco. At Boulogne: 1 bale leaf tobacco, 1 case chocolate and 50 one-litre cans siccative. At Portel: 35 one-litre cans siccative. The bales tobacco are marked with various marks: "BTG," "HGM," "AMN."
