Dear Sirs,

I duly received Mr. Aspinall's letter of the 23rd instant, respecting the case of the Steamer "WITIAZ", from which it is noted that this vessel is at present in Belfast and is being reconditioned for the carriage of fruit, and that you have informed Messrs. Workman Clark & Co. that as the additional deck which is being fitted in the holds is only required for the carriage of fruit or light cargoes, and as the Owners do not require it to be recorded in the Register Book as a deck, no exception will be taken to the deck and the beams thereof provided nothing detrimental done to the structure of the vessel.


With regard to the cargo doors which are proposed to be fitted in the Ship's sides in the 'tween decks, I have to state that provided these doors be constructed as shown on the plan, the same will be approved.
