Dear Sirs,

With reference to your letter of the 28th ultimo, respecting the fees chargeable in the case of the machinery made by Messrs. The Central Marine Engine Works for the S.S. "WESTERN VALLEYS" (your first entry report No.15671), I have to inform you that the ordinary Rule classification and first entry fees will be chargeable to the Builders. In addition, there will be an amount chargeable to the Department of the Controller General of Merchant Shipbuilding equal to 50% of the difference between the fees as a Standard Vessel and the ordinary classification fees, which in this case amounts to £12: 0: 0.

An account has to-day been rendered to the Ministry of Shipping for this fee, and on payment your account will be credited accordingly. I shall therefore be glad if you will kindly see that the necessary entries are now made in your Rough Fee and Debit Books in the usual way.
