The above vessel left this port ostensibly for Japan as per Calcutta Report No.9460 dated the 25th June 1935, but returned to Calcutta a few days ago, having carried cargoes on the Indian Coast. It was pointed out to the Master and Owners' Agents that this proceeding was irregular, as Interim Certificates had only been issued to enable the vessel to proceed to Japan for breaking up purposes.

The vessel and machinery have therefore been again examined as per Calcutta Report No.9505 dated the 24th August, 1935 and fresh certificates have been issued. It is stated that the ship will now proceed to Japan, carrying a cargo of Pig Iron, where she will be broken up.
