
H. With reference to the Special Survey No.3 which became due so long ago as April 1932 on the steamer "STANLEYVILLE", I have to acquaint you that this vessel has been sold by the Cie. Maritime Belge (Lloyd Rygal) S.A., to the Hughes Bolckow Shipbreaking Co., Ltd., for breaking up purposes in Japan.

A report has now come to hand from the Society's Surveyors at Newcastle from which it appears that a satisfactory general examination of the vessel and the Boiler Survey have been held at that port, and in the circumstances the Committee have agreed to her proceeding to Japan with a cargo of scrap as ballast.

In the circumstances I shall be glad if you will give the case attention and advise me immediately the work of demolition has been commenced.
