Précis of particulars of Casualty

This steamer, carrying a cargo of coal, is reported to have foundered during a heavy gale on 1st April about 17 miles W. by N. of the Casquets. It is stated that a link in the steering gear snapped, and the vessel was helpless in the trough of cross-breaking seas.

No reply has yet been received to the casualty notice sent to the Owners.

SOURCE OF INFORMATION.

BEATTY ROSE.—Brixham, Apr. 2.—Norwegian steamer Pan landed at Brixham during the night master and full crew of 13 all told of British steamer Beatty Rose, which foundered about 17 miles N.W. of Casquets at 12.30 p.m. on Apr. 1 in heavy gale.
London, Apr. 3.—The Norwegian steamer Pan landed at Brixham on Friday night (Apr. 1) the crew of thirteen of the steamer Beatty Rose, Swansea for Rouen, with coal. The Beatty Rose encountered the full force of a heavy W.S.W. gale in the Channel during Friday. About seventeen miles west by north off the Casquets Captain Roberts discovered the steamer was leaking badly. When heaving her head to the sea, a link in the steering gear snapped and the Beatty Rose was helpless in the trough of the cross-breaking seas. The waves broke clean over her and the water gained rapidly on the pumps. The Beatty Rose was abandoned and the crew took to the boat. About four hours later they were rescued by the Norwegian steamer Pan.
