Dear Sirs:-

We have your favor of the 29th and note your remarks on Motor Boat "Trolltind".

We are making some repairs on here along lines as suggested by our Mr. F.S. Pendleton on given orders to have certain work done with view of determining whether we should operate the vessel with this machinery or use the hull for some other machinery that we have in view. For that reason, we cannot state whether we should desire to class the vessel as a motor ship or not.

We would not care to determine at this time whether we should want a classification for her or not and it is largely to get the boat cleaned up and in shape that we are going to some expense to decide.

When we determine just what we will do with the machinery, we can take the matter up, but we do not consider the steamer in any condition at this time until she is fixed to call for inspection.
