Dear Sirs,

With reference to the classification in this Society's Register Book of the Motor Vessel "TROLLTIND", which it is understood has now become your property, I beg to remind you that according to the Society's Rules the Special Annual Survey of the Oil Engines became due so long ago as May, 1920. Permanent repairs also require to be carried out to the windlass, steering gear and deck fittings.

It would appear that early in March last the Society's Surveyors at Newport News examined the vessel on account of damage stated to have been sustained through grounding and fire, and that a specification for repairs was drawn up.

In the circumstances I shall be glad to learn for the information of the Committee what definite arrangements you propose making for the necessary survey to be held and the repairs effected, in order to the retention of the vessel's class in the Register Book.
