In reply to your classing letter of 7th March 1924, we have to say that the donkey boilers are only fitted in place provisionally and would require to be permanently fixed . -

Nothing was done at Genoa regarding these boilers, for reasons connected with the Italian Customs duties payable on boilers imported from abroad . -

Safety valves are fitted, but were not opened up . -
Easing gear is not yet fitted . -

We understand that the Owners will probably take advantage of an opportunity at a non-Italian port to have these boilers fitted properly and put into service . -

For this reason it was suggested that a note might be made in the Special Reasons List . -
