examine and test at their works on the 18th April 1912

a cast steel anchor head, weighing 30:2:2 cwt.,

and, as far as could be ascertained, found it to be a good casting.


After the casting had been dropped from a clear height of twelve feet on to an iron slab, it was hammered, whilst suspended, and gave no indication of defects.

A satisfactory bending test was made from a test piece cast with the casting.
