Dear Sirs,

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 11th instant, regarding the classification fees in the case of the s.s. "BRANSTONE".

It appears from what you say that Messrs. Colby Brothers, Ltd. have broken their contract with you in not handing over the ship duly classed, and with a certificate of classification. If, in consequence of this breach of contract, you have to pay the fees yourselves in order to get the certificate, the Committee are advised that you would have a direct claim against Messrs. Colby for damages in respect of the breach, and that it is not necessary that any claim should be put forward in the name of the Society.

I have therefore to add that on receipt from you of a cheque for the amount of the fees in question I shall be glad to hand you the certificate of classification.
