Dear Sirs,

With reference to the case of your new s.s. "BRANSTONE" which was recently built by Messrs. Colby Brothers Ltd., at Lowestoft, I beg to inform you that in accordance with the usual practice an account for the fees and expenses due for the survey of this vessel during construction with a view to being classed in this Society's Register Book was rendered to Messrs. Colby Brothers on the 4th ultimo.

As it now appears from a notice I have received from Messrs. Colby Brothers that in view of the Company's inability to carry on their business they have been compelled to take steps to go into voluntary liquidation, it is concluded that the survey fees, which I would point out must be paid before the Classification of the vessel can be completed, will be settled by your goodselves, and I beg to hand you herewith accounts for the amounts due.

I shall then be in a position to put the matter forward with a view to the completion of the Classification and the issue of the customary certificates.
