

Bordeaux 8<sup>th</sup> Novembre 1913.

Dear Mr. Reck. Heene,

To hand your kind private letter of the 1<sup>st</sup> instant re "France" -

I quite agree with your suggestion as to the repartition of fees on machinery at 46 £. -  $\frac{2}{3}$ <sup>rd</sup> of which for London office and  $\frac{1}{3}$ <sup>rd</sup> for Bordeaux office, the machinery not having been constructed at this port -

This appropriation would seem to me the more appropriate, the machinery having been constructed at a different port than that where the machinery is fitted on boards.

I intended considering my visits as ordinary visits for which the total fees (mine) would have conceded with the above  $\frac{1}{3}$ <sup>rd</sup> of total fees £46 as above stated.
