Alx. No 2.16, when her tanks have been surveyed, and one bower anchor & 15 fathoms of cable placed on board, and subject to permanent repairs being done to her hull being fit to carry Perishable Goods. The temporary repairs which have been now effected, are of such a nature, which will enable the vessel, in my opinion, to continue trading, as requested by the Admiralty.
