S. I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 21st instant with further reference to the case of your reinforced concrete Motor Vessel "VIOLETTE" in the case of which the Committee have decided to make a record in the Register Book of "In port damaged 1-21" and to expunge the class, and enquiring whether it is to be understood that the renewal of the classification of this vessel after repairs will not be entertained by the Committee.

In reply I have to call your attention to the remarks of the Surveyors who inspected this vessel in their report, a copy of which has been supplied to your goodselves and to say that in all the circumstances the Surveyors are of opinion that a satisfactory repair of the vessel for the purposes of re-classification in the Society's Register Book cannot be effected, and that this opinion is concurred in by the Committee.
