## Particulars of Examination and Repairs (if any) Docking

Done:- Vessel in dry dock. Propeller, stern bush and outer fastenings examined. Wear down 3/16"

Sea cocks and valves opened up, cleaned, examined, found or placed in good condition.

and Tear Repairs:- I. P. crankpin brasses remetalled and refitted.

Main condenser doors renewed.

Sanitary pump discharge manifold renewed.

Other minor repairs effected.

Steering gear tried out and proven in good order.

## General Observations, Opinion, and Recommendation:-

State clearly what alteration, if any, is suggested to be made in the existing classification of the vessel's machinery in the Register Book, consequent upon this survey, and also any alteration required to be made in the records of the vessel's machinery, boilers, working pressures, &c.; thus, for example, B.S. 9,11, B.E.M.S. 9,11, \*LMC. 9,11, or \*LMC 140 lb., F.D., &c.)
