Dear Sirs,

With reference to the case of the Steamer "BLACK OSPREY", I beg to acquaint you that the reports of the Survey held on this vessel by the Society's Surveyors at Baltimore in December/January last have now come to hand, from which it appears that the vessel was seen in dry dock and the greater part of the Survey for reinstatement of class was carried out.

As a result of this inspection notations of "100A1 Reclassification Contemplated" and "Examined 1,41" were assigned to indicate that from the parts then seen the vessel was considered to be in an efficient condition for twelve months, but it is understood that she has since, unfortunately, become a casualty.


