riveting renewed, together with some plating in the peak tank

Tee bars have in some cases been substituted.

New seatings have been fitted in the engine room

and the donkey boiler platform altered all in accordance with
approved plans.

The subdivision of the tank in way of the
machinery has also been altered.

It is submitted the vessel appears worthy to
remain as classed with Survey No. 3 and notation of

S.S. No. 3-5, 39, without special condition.
