Dear Sirs,

I beg to acquaint you that the Society's Surveyors at Hull, have forwarded to this office the account dated 31st January, rendered to your good selves in connexion with the survey of the steamer "FRENCH ROSE", and with regard to your remarks thereon, I have to point out that the amount of the fees referred to was incurred in connexion with the survey in November last of repairs of damage due to collision in the River Thames.

The vessel having been placed in drydock at Goole, for the purpose of having the damage repairs effected, a survey became necessary under the Society's Rules, section 22, paragraph 2, with a view to the continuance of the vessel's class in the Register Book. and I shall accordingly be glad to be favoured with a remittance in due course.

I have to add that the Surveyors have been informed that the account of fees for their services in connexion with your steamer "MOSS ROSE", is not to be pressed for.
