The 1st Special Survey No. 1 has been held on the hull.

The London Surveyors now report the vessel placed in dry dock, the bottom coated, and minor repairs carried out.

Shell plates D.2 & E.2 (s.s.), as above, continue efficient.

It is submitted the vessel appears worthy to remain as classed with record of survey 5.40, subject as above.
