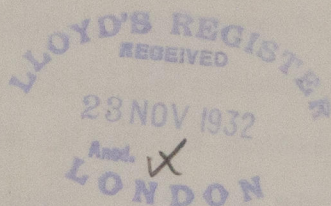

Dear Sir,

We beg to inform you that the steamer "JACOBUS", which vessel has recently been under survey at Bristol, for re-assignment of freeboard, prior to bunkering at this port, has complied with the following Convention requirements.

1. Cleats fitted 24" apart, to the cross bunker and wing bunker hatches in the bridge space, 2½" wood covers, one tarpaulin and battening down arrangements supplied for these hatches.
2. Flush bunker scuttle on port side in bridge space, cover satisfactorily repaired.

We are informed that this vessel is proceeding to Fowey where the survey will be completed.

A copy of this letter is being forwarded to the Falmouth Surveyors for their information.
