Sir,

I am in receipt of your letter of the 12th. instant  
regarding the assignment of freeboard for the S.S. "JACOBUS",  
owned by Messrs. Livingstone & Cooper, and in reply to  
your questions I beg to state that the "bolted plates" at the  
front are secured to the bulkhead plating by bolts  
not more than six inches studded into bulkhead plating  
the sliding door plates secured by nuts on outside, therefore  
closing appliances are in accordance with Class A requirements.

The depth of the hatch webs at the centre is 22 ins. as  
shown on the approved plan and the depth 11 ins. on the report  
of the depth at the side of the hatchways.
